BAN LIFTED ON SUNDAY HUNTING

Legislation I supported (Act 36 of 2025) gives the Pennsylvania Game Commission authority to decide which hunting seasons can include Sundays. Sunday hunting was prohibited altogether and then, starting in 2020, limited to three times a year.

Pennsylvania's 850,000 licensed hunters will have greater flexibility to spend time outdoors. Hunting contributes more than \$1.6 billion each year to our state's economy; hopefully, this change for Sunday hunting will grow that figure.

The Game Commission incorporated more Sundays into its schedule. See the inside of this newsletter for hunting seasons and bag limits.



LOCAL WATERWAYS PROVIDE FOR FANTASTIC FISHING

There is no de-bait-ing that Pennsylvania is great for trout fishing. Every spring, the Dauphin County Anglers & Conservationists volunteer to help the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission stock local waterways.

We've stocked brook, rainbow, golden rainbows and brown trout locally in recent years, with some of them being more than 20 inches long.

The Fish and Boat Commission will host its Fish for Free days on Sunday, May 24, and Saturday, July 4, in 2026. No license is required, but all other fishing regulations still apply.

DO YOU KNOW?

SUMMER MEANS **TURKEY-COUNTING TIME!**

The Pennsylvania Game Commission often seeks public participation in surveying wild turkeys over the summer. Watch my e-newsletter (*RepMehaffie.com/email-signup*) or the Game Commission's website for information about the next survey period.

Participants are asked to record the number of wild turkeys they see, along with the county, township, wildlife management unit (WMU), date and contact information if agency biologists have any questions. Participants may also simply drop a "pin" on the map for the location data to automatically populate. Location data are used only for the survey, not for law enforcement and are not shared.

Participation is important for turkey population management. Survey data allow the agency to determine total wild turkey productivity and compare long-term reproductive success within Pennsylvania and across states, as this is a standard methodology used across the country. Data also are used in the turkey population model to track population trends.

This can be your opportunity to talk turkey and help researchers at the same time.
